

One event Steve and I were invited to on February 7th, was the AtlanticCare Red Tie/Red Dress Fundraiser for the Cardiology Department at Smithville Inn. The NJ Odd Fellows and The AtlantiCare Foundation have been partnering on some projects over the last two years and this invite happened to be as a result of the Odd Fellows' donation of \$10,000.00 toward AED units. We enjoyed a wonderful evening of music, gift auctions and great food with Jim (Union Lodge No. 213 Noble Grand) and Sandy Smith. Thanks to our Order, we really make a difference in the world as we humbly remain just faces in the crowd...

This past February, we unexpectedly lost one of those humble faces, Pastor Hippolito Roman, PGM PGP. I met Pastor on many occasions at Odd Fellow events prior to becoming and Odd Fellow and immediately reminded me of my Grandfather because they had the same facial features but Pop Pop was Polish. Pastor was EV-ERYWHERE I went with camera in tow. Since I always carried a camera—I'm not of his camera caliber—we had a common interest and he would educate me without me even knowing it. We really began our friendship when I started doing the Samaritan after Hurricane Sandy to help Dan LeFever with the look of his newsletter. Pastor jumped right on board with literally hundreds of photos from a single event, and remember he was everywhere...

...an extraordinary loss to the Order in ways we may not even realize yet.

By the time I officially joined the Odd Fellows in 2014, Pastor and I were becoming a great collaborative team as he helped me with The Samaritan as it became my project. We tried the half English/half Spanish issue but it became too lengthy. We limited the dual language to Officer's messages but again it became too lengthy so we decided we'd do it occasionally. I think

at one point he believed I could speak Spanish because I'd throw out some of my rudimentary Spanish once in a while, or email him in Spanish, but in email I used Google Translate. Funny thing was when he'd send me articles in Spanish and English, he'd use Google Translate too, so we'd get a good laugh at the strange translations. Either way we both trusted each other to correct our attempts at communications and get the job done. He had great sense of humor.

As my friendship with Pastor grew, I realized that he was a true gentlemen and family man, as well as a stellar role model for Odd Fellowship. It didn't matter what his role was, he remained on an even keel, was always willing to help, did his work extremely efficiently, and followed through with his responsibilities as it states in our Encampment charge (page 164): "... Your duties well performed will make others ambitious to emulate or excel you. Whatever you do, let it be done cheerfully, promptly, and effectively." Pastor's death is an extraordinary loss to our Order in ways we may not even realize yet.

Sometimes, and quite by accident, we hear or read things that we need to hear. I stumbled on this quote by George Bernard Shaw (below this message), which is apt when remembering my Samaritan co conspirator, our brother Pastor. Past President, Ana Galan, Living A Full And Active Life

N 2013, ANA GALAN, NOW 71, started noticing some unusual symptoms. The Union City resident wasn't able to urinate during the day but was going frequently at night. Her primary care physician at the time sent her for a CT scan, which detected a cyst on her right kidney. He told her not to worry about it and to do a repeat scan in six months. "My son wasn't happy with the physician's recommendation and urged me to see his doctor," she says.

So Ana made an appointment with **Francisco Gonzalez**, **M.D.**, a primary care physician at **Palisades Medical Center**. Dr. Gonzalez reviewed the scans.

"I didn't like the appearance of the cyst, so I wanted to make sure we took a closer look," he says. Dr. Gonzalez referred Ana to **John Kerns**, **M.D.**, a urologist at Palisades. Dr. Kerns ordered another CT scan, which enabled them to visualize the lesion in more detail. The results showed the cyst was suspicious for cancer, so he recommended Ana undergo a biopsy. The biopsy revealed she had cancer.

"I was shocked," she says. "I never expected to hear the words *You have cancer*." Ultimately, Ana underwent a complete nephrectomy, having her right kidney removed. The cancer hadn't spread beyond the kidney, so she didn't require any additional treatment.

ONGOING CARE TO STAY WELL

Since 2013, Ana has received ongoing care from Dr. Gonzalez and **Stephen Thomsen**, **M.D.**, a nephrologist at Palisades. She visits Dr. Gonzalez and Dr. Thomsen every three months, and the physicians are in close communication about Ana's care.

"For a patient like Ana, close follow-up is essential,"
Dr. Gonzalez says. "Given the fact that she has only one kidney, we want to do everything we can to prevent further deterioration of her kidney function."
Dr. Gonzalez works closely with Ana to provide

preventive care. He makes sure her blood pressure and cholesterol levels are well-controlled and that she doesn't develop diabetes, which can damage her kidney.

In addition, whenever Ana needs to take a new medication, she always discusses it with Dr. Gonzalez first. For example, she has to take medicine to treat severe knee osteoarthritis, but the dose she takes is limited because she has only one kidney to filter it. Dr. Gonzalez always safely guides Ana through managing her medications and routinely checks her kidney function to ensure she stays well.

'I WOULDN'T GO ANYWHERE ELSE'

Thanks to the care that Dr. Gonzalez and other physicians have provided along the way, Ana is able to lead a busy and active life. She enjoys spending time with her grandchildren, is very involved in her community and travels.

"No words can adequately describe the gratitude I feel for Dr. Gonzalez or his kindness or compassion," Ana says.
"I'm also so grateful for the care and attention I've received at Palisades.
They treat me like family. I wouldn't go anywhere else."
